

## RESOLUTION

It is RESOLVED that the Town of Lincolnville shall provide for inspection of electrical installations within the Town and that the requirements of electrical inspections shall pertain to original installation of electrical equipment, and alterations or additions to existing electrical equipment.

It is FURTHER RESOLVED that the requirement of electrical inspections shall pertain to all of the territory of the municipality of the Town of Lincolnville.


It is FURTHER RESOLVED that no electrical equipment may be installed within or on any publicly or privately owned building, structure or premises, nor may any alterations or addition be made in any such existing equipment without first obtaining a permit for that installation or alteration from the Electrical Inspector, except for minor repair work as set forth in Title 30-A M.R.S.A., Sec. 4173(1), and except as set forth in the exceptions in Title 30-A M.R.S.A., Sec. 4152.


The powers and authority of the Electrical Inspector shall conform with the authority set forth in Title 30-A M.R.S.A., Sec. 4172 and Sec. 4173, and the Electrical Inspector shall issue permits in accordance with the standards set forth in Title 30-A M.R.S.A., Sections 4161, 4162 and 4163.


An Electrical Inspector for the Town of Lincolnville shall be appointed annually (to a one year term) by the Board of Selectmen. The Board of Selection may also choose to appoint an Alternate Electrical Inspector to serve in the absence of the Electrical Inspector. The Alternate Electrical Inspector shall also be appointed to a one year term of office.


The fees for electrical permits shall be as set forth in the Town of Lincolnville "Commercial Electrical Permit Application" and the "Certification of the National Electrical Code" form (versions dated 6/2011 as attached). The fees collected for electrical permits shall be divided equally (50/50) between the Town of Lincolnville and the Electrical Inspector. In addition, if the Electrical Inspector is required to "certify to code" any residential electrical work done by the property owner, the inspector shall be entitled to receive the full certification fee charged for such inspections.


